



"A lot of people like to stop and look at these old cars. Most


people who stop and look have never seen a Sprite before.

BE PRACTICAL Essential maintenance

Sprite can be kept running reliably through the year. David Lillywhite is your guide to fault-free convertible motoring.

YOU WANT open-top fun? You want easy maintenance? You want budget buying and running costs? You want a Spridget — more correctly known as an Austin Healey Sprite or an MG Midget.

Small size apart, a Spridget is just so practical. It's no problem to run one every day, all through the year (yes, even in the winter), provided you follow a few basic maintenance tips — nothing difficult, and nothing more unusual than a grease gun needed in your toolbox to carry them out. Combine a regular service following your manual with this article, and your Spridget will last longer, be more reliable and cost you less in the long term.

The range changed significantly in appearance between the launch of the first Spridget, the Mk I Sprite, and the last, the Midget 1500. Mechanically, though, most parts are similar, with the exception of the 1500's Triumphsourced engine and Morris Marina-derived gearbox. This means we can cover all Spridgets in this article.

WAXSTAT JETS: late 1500s often suffer from poor idling in heavy traffic, particularly when weather is warm. This is usually due to faulty Waxstat (or Capstat) jets in the SU carburettors, which can be converted to conventional jets. Moss sell conversion kits for £28.20, or you can buy replacement Waxstats.

INLET MANIFOLD: another common cause of erratic idling (on all models) is a leaking inlet manifold gasket. Grab the air filters while the engine is running and see if the assembly moves up and down, and listen for idle speed changing.

VALVEGEAR: for increased reliability, fit an external rocker oil feed kit to your 1500 engine. It costs £19.40 from Moss, and is easy to fit. At the same time, it's worth retro-fitting valve stem oil seals (part number AEK113 from Heritage suppliers) to reduce oil consumption.

OIL COOLER: 1500 engine runs hot in confined engine bay. Counteract this by fitting oil cooler, preferably one with a thermostat. Some kits incorporate an anti-drain back valve, which prevents the oil draining back into the sump overnight and so prevents oil starvation on start-up. Engine will last longer with these parts.

BREATHER VALVE: if oil consumption is excessive, there may be a split in inlet manifoldmounted engine breather valve's diaphragm (not all models have this valve). Replace valve.

WHEEL BEARINGS: front wheel bearings are a bit weak. A sure sign of impending failure is a humming noise from the front. Jack up the car and spin each wheel — the dodgy bearing will feel rough and may have play in it. Replace it. degrees C thermostat. When the weather gets warmer, go back to 82 degrees C thermostat.

GEAR SELECTION: if your A-series engined Spridget is difficult to get into gear, check clevis pins on the clutch slave cylinder and clutch pedal for wear. Check pivot holes for ovality.

For a more efficient heater during winter, fit 88

HANDBRAKE: a rattle from the rear of a pre-1976 Spridget is often due to missing felt washers on handbrake mechanism clevis pins. These are on the rods that run from the centre of the axle to the rear brake hubs. There should be at least two felt washers per joint.

SPRIDGET AT A GLANCE

- Austin Healey Sprite Mk I launched 1958. Nicknamed the 'Frogeye' (or 'Bugeye' in USA) due to headlight pods perched on bonnet. 948cc A-series engine, quarter elliptic rear springs, no boot lid, bolt-on sidescreens.
- Mk II Sprite and near-identical MG Midget Mk I replaced Frogeye mid-1961. More
- conventional looks, opening boot lid. 1098cc engines and disc brakes from October 1962.
- Mk III Sprite and Mk II Midget with wind-up windows and half-elliptic rear springs announced March 1964.
- Mk IV Sprite and Mk III Midget given 1275cc A-series engine, plus fully-folding hood, from October 1966.
- Austin Healey Sprite rebadged as Austin Sprite at end of 1970, then dropped altogether in July 1970.
- Rubber bumper Midget 1500 introduced October 1974, with 1493cc Triumph engine, Marina-derived gearbox, higher ride height and energy-absorbing bumpers.
 Last Midget built December 1979.

HANDBRAKE: a common complaint is that there is no adjustment left on the handbrake, despite the rear brakes being adjusted correctly. This is usually down to wear in the clevis pins at various points in the handbrake linkage. They are extremely cheap to replace, but check the parts they swivel in for wear as well.

RUST BUSTER

- Of all the Spridget's rust-prone areas, the front mounting point of the rear leaf springs is the most easily overlooked, and one of the most difficult to repair. Check from under the wheelarch, and inside the car by lifting the floor covering behind rear seats. Keep mount clean and sprayed with rust-proofing wax.
- In rainy weather, consider removing the footwell carpets (if fitted) and making do with rubber mats. There's just no way you will stop a Spridget from leaking some water in heavy rain, and carpets will soak it up and cause rust in the floors.
- However, some water leaks are curable check the gaskets around the wiper motor wheelboxes, and those that seal the wiper jets to the body — both are a common cause of water in the footwell. If all else fails, remove kickboards in footwells — inner wing may have rusted, allowing water in.

WIRE WHEELS: a sharp knocking noise when accelerating or braking hard on a wire-wheeled car indicates that a wheel spinner is loose, or the wheel-to-hub splines are in need of greasing. Check splines for wear and sharp edges.

- Front inner wings have a triangulated, double-skinned section that is open to the elements, allowing water and road dirt into the structure. Clear this out regularly.
- Hose out all the common mud traps inside the front wings around the headlights and indicator/sidelight units, behind the rear wheels, and around the inside of the rear wheelarches.
- Regularly inject rust-proofing wax into the sills and box sections, and also spray the door hinge panels (with the door open) and insides of the wings. Wire-brush these areas first.
- Open boot (except on Frogeye) and spray rust-proofing wax into gap between inner wheelarches and the outer wings, making sure the wax reaches right to the front of the arches. On Frogeye, do this from the boot opening behind the seats.

MASTER CYLINDER: combined brake and clutch master cylinder used on early disc brake models is difficult to find new, but original cylinder can be resleeved by engineering company if faulty.

HORN: if horn goes off by itself, particularly when going round a corner, steering rack thrust washers may be worn. Replace or rebuild rack.

OIL PRESSURE: pre-Aug 1977 models have an oil pressure gauge — so use it! A-Series engines should give 60psi or more at 3000rpm when engine is hot. 1500s should be 50-55psi at 3000rpm.

REAR AXLE: if the car seems to squirm about at the rear when you decelerate and accelerate on a straight road, check the tightness of the U-bolts that attach the axle to the rear springs. Make sure the rubber insulating pads under the axle are in good condition. BRAKE ADJUSTERS: don't try to free off seized drum brake adjusters with spanners, molegrips, etc. Strip the brakes down, remove the brake backplates and place the adjusters in a vice. A bit of penetrating oil and the application of heat will free them off — you'll ruin them any other way, and end up having to buy new adjusters.

UNAVAILABLE PARTS

EVEN new bodyshells are available: all except the Frogeye come from Heritage specialists, Frogeye from Wheeler & Davis (01455 220689). There are a few minor parts that you can't buy new but there are plenty of secondhand spares about.

However, Graham Paddy from specialists Moss Europe (0181 948 6666) says the parts that are causing them the most difficulty at the moment are the combined master cylinders for early disc brake models and rear brake backplates. Mechanical tachometer drive on early cars is also a problem.
